In the 1850s James Lord Pierpont wrote the song with the name "The One Horse Open Sleigh" to celebrate winter sleigh races. It has been performed many ways over the years and became a holiday standard a century after it was written. In Cook County, Minnesota, it is sung as dogs and sleds are getting ready for a race without a horse, the John Beargrease race.

Born in 1858, John Makwabimide (Beargrease) lived with his brothers Debaashi (Underneath) also known as Peter, and Bashkwegin (Leather) who was also known as Joseph. They lived in Beaver Bay and delivered mail using dogsleds between 1897 and 1899. Gii-baapigooyaan apii animibizod ge-bimishinaan! He laughed as there I sprawling lie but quickly drove away!

Nagamobiisaawin Niiwin / Verse Four:

Noongom gaa-gabezoogipon, bimaagonen noongom; Now the ground is white, go it while you're young; Wiijiiwaag ikwezensag, dash o'ow nagamowin. Take the girls tonight, and sing this sleighing song.

Gidaa-debinaa bebezhigoogaanzhii, ge gizhiibaatood; Just get a bob tailed bay, two-forty as his speed;

Zagibizh biboonodaabaaning dash ogimaakandawad! Hitch him to an open sleigh and crack! You'll take the lead!
